WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW ABOUT MORE COMMUNITY FOUNDATION

More Community Foundation* (MCF) is a non-profit organisation and the Foundation for the MORE Family Collection group, supporting social development and environmental conservation in Southern Africa. All community projects for social development are self-sustainable, as it is our belief that by supporting communities to contribute their own efforts and skills, projects are kept alive into the future. Socially inclusive conservation is critical to biological diversity and MCF strives to achieve community collaboration and custodianship within all conservation projects.

Our Board of Trustees includes a MORE Family Collection representative, an environmental education and community representative, a NPO and community development advisor and a legal and governance advisor.

The majority of our Foundation's administrative costs are covered through fundraising events with only 7,5% of donor funds used for this purpose. This means that 92,5% of all donations are channelled into approved beneficiary projects.

OUR CORE PILLARS



1. Education and Skills Development

Empowering individuals through education and skill-building. We support early childhood development, primary and high schooling education, tertiary education, and training in ICT, Nature Conservation, and Hospitality. Additionally, we prioritize adult skills development through community-based learning programs. By investing in education and skills, we aim to support our communities, enabling individuals to create their own job opportunities and contribute to community growth.

Sustainable Development Goal 4: Quality Education

Ensure inclusive and equitable quality education and promote lifelong learning opportunities for all. Obtaining a quality education is the foundation to improving people's lives and sustainable development. Major progress has been made towards increasing access to education at all levels and increasing enrolment rates in schools, particularly for girls. Nevertheless, millions of children and adults remain deprived of educational opportunities, often due to poverty, inequality, and other barriers.



2. Enterprise Development

Supporting local businesses and creating economic opportunities. We believe in fostering entrepreneurship and driving local trade for community growth. By facilitating the development of local enterprises and providing MFC-supported initiatives, we stimulate demand and enable trading within the community. Our goal is to empower individuals, create employment opportunities, and contribute to the local economy.

Sustainable Development Goal 8: Decent Work and Economic Growth

Promote sustained, inclusive, and sustainable economic growth, full and productive employment, and decent work for all. Sustainable economic growth will require societies to create the conditions that allow people to have quality jobs that stimulate the economy while not harming the environment. Job opportunities and decent working conditions are also required for the whole working-age population.

3. Improving Living Standards



Our core focus is improving living standards through essential services and clean water access. We address basic human needs for better community quality of life, including secure environments, basic healthcare, proper sanitation, and clean, running water. We promote sustainability by installing solar or renewable energy-powered boreholes in underprivileged areas. Our goal is to fulfill human rights, prevent illness, and reduce child mortality rates.

Sustainable Development Goal 6: Clean Water and Sanitation

Ensure availability and sustainable management of water and sanitation for all. Clean, accessible water for all is an essential part of the world we want to live in. There is sufficient fresh water on the planet to achieve this. 4. Conservation & Human Wildlife Conflict



Caring for the Earth's natural environment and resources for future generations. We engage in community-based conservation, environmental education, and human-wildlife conflict mitigation. By preserving species diversity, ecosystems, and natural functions, we maintain a healthy environmental balance. Every species and habitat are essential for our planet's well-being, providing us with oxygen, water, and food. South Africa's natural resources, including its biodiversity, drive economic growth through tourism and contribute to social development. By involving communities, we promote collaboration and custodianship, ensuring the protection of our natural heritage. Through Conservation & Human-Wildlife Conflict, we strive to create a sustainable future, where nature thrives, communities prosper, and the delicate balance of our planet is preserved.

Sustainable Development Goal 15: Life on Land

Protect, restore, and promote sustainable use of terrestrial ecosystems, sustainably manage forests, combat desertification, and halt and reverse land degradation and halt biodiversity loss. Sustainably managed forests, combating desertification, halting and reversing land degradation, and halting biodiversity loss are integral to achieving sustainable development. 1. EDUCATION AND SKILLS DEVELOPMENT [SDG4: QUALITY EDUCATION]

Sponsored by: *Lion Sands Game Reserve, Mpumalanga*

Jabez Preschool

Jabez Preschool opened in 2018, and was built and developed by More Community Foundation (MCF) for the local children of Justicia B Village who did not have access to an Early Childhood Development centre. The school has two classrooms, an office, a playground, indoor and outdoor kitchens, a security and store room and ablution block. The school is currently managed by the local community with operational support from MCF and we are in the process of handing it over to the Department of Education. In 2023, 87 learners are enrolled (up from 51 in 2022) with two teachers and a school principal. The school serves children from Justicia, Lillydale and Huntington villages.

NEEDS: Third classroom; Additional ablution block; Repairs to the indoor and outdoor kitchens; A vegetable tunnel; Roof repairs.



Huntington Digital Learning Campus

Sponsored by: *Lion Sands Game Reserve, Mpumalanga*



Digital education is provided to school-going learners (from preschool through to matric), with a bridging academy for young adults. The centre is managed by a team from The Good Work Foundation (GWF) and is fully funded by More Community Foundation on behalf of Lion Sands Game Reserve (and its four lodges in the Sabi Sand Reserve and Kruger National Park). GWF is our implementation partner and runs the education courses and the centre, fulfilling this critical need in the community. 65 Students are enrolled in the Bridging Academy course and 578 learners in the Open Academy Learning platform, and they come from Huntington (where the campus is located), Justicia and Lillydale villages.

NEEDS: Financial support towards operational costs.

In partnership with: *Stanley & Livingstone Boutique Hotel, Victoria Falls*

Masuwe Primary School

More Community Foundation Zimbabwe (MCF ZW) was introduced to the school by Stanley & Livingstone Boutique Hotel shortly after MORE Family Collection took over in 2017. Currently there are 164 children enrolled at the school, including an Early Childhood Development class. The school has 5 teachers (including the headmistress) – one of whom is a volunteer. MCF completed the building of two extra cottages and a new ablution block for the learners. We can now proceed with building a 3-classroom block in line with our plan to build a secondary school for the community (refer separate priority project).

NEEDS: New classrooms; Kitchen; Jungle gym; School fence; Electricity infrastructure; Replastering and repainting existing classrooms; Installing a vegetable garden tunnel and trench; Roof repairs.





Masuwe Secondary School

There is currently no secondary school in the rural village of Woodlands. This means that when learners complete their primary education, very few have the means to proceed to secondary schools in other villages due to a lack of transport and accommodation. Most learners, therefore, drop out of school. MCF therefore plans to build a secondary school that will serve the educational needs of the children from Woodlands and the neighbouring community.

NEEDS: Funding towards classrooms; Admin office; Ablutions; A borehole; Teachers' cottages; A vegetable garden.



Motshabaesi Primary School

Motshabaesi is a Primary School situated in Obakeng Village in the North West Province, enrolling 230 learners a year.

MCF aims to grow our support and involvement in the school through further education, and improving the standard and quality of education learners currently receive.

NEEDS: New ablution block.



Heuningvley Primary School

In partnership with: *Marataba Luxury Lodges and Marataba Community & Conservation Foundation, Limpopo*

The school enrolls 309 learners every year from grade 1 to grade 7, supporting children from the neighbouring reserves, villages and farms. Situated in a very remote farm, the school struggles with no water and no electricity.

Our strategy is to strengthen the partnership between Marakele National Park representatives, the Marataba Community & Conservation Foundation (MCCF), and the school.

NEEDS: Electricity infrastructure; A new ablution; School sign board; A new kitchen; Admin block.



Injongo Educare Centre

In partnership with: *Cape Cadogan Boutique Hotel and More Quarters Neighbourhood Hotel, Cape Town*

Injongo Educare Centre is managed by Matchbox, a Cape Town based organisation supporting education for children in townships. The centre enrolls up to 65 children from the Mfuleni area in Cape Town, and approximately 80 children from neighbouring schools in the after-school care program. Injongo is constructed out of shipping containers, situated on a very small block of land. As a rare commodity in urban townships, the centre is in desperate need of more space.

NEEDS: Vegetable garden; Repairs to the ablution block and classroom infrastructure.

Sponsored by: Lion Sands Game Reserve, Mpumalanga

Henna Preschool was More Community Foundation's first project, commencing in 2002. Over the more than 20+ years to follow, our relationship with the school has fostered a positive relationship with the community, assisting us with the successful launch of other projects in the Huntington Village.

The school currently has a total of 11 permanent staff members, including teachers, cooks, cleaners and a security guard. Henna is also in the process of being registered and handed over to the Department of Education. Henna also accommodates toddlers in the New Beginnings Daycare project (which has been providing support to young mothers for their babies and toddlers for more than 14 years). The babies were moved to Henna in 2019.

NEEDS: Repairs to roof and ceiling in two classrooms; Repairs to indoor kitchen; New classroom windows; Repairs to electricity wiring.

Wonderful Beginnings ECD



In partnership with: Lion Sands Game Reserve, Mpumalanga

In 2023, we took on the responsibility of supporting another Early Childhood Development (ECD) centre in the Huntington Village, located near the Lion Sands Game Reserve in Bushbuckridge. This decision was made after community leaders brought the centre's need for assistance to our attention. It was discovered that the school, named Wonderful Beginnings, has only one volunteer teacher who educates and cares for 12 learners (including four in grade 1, and eight in grade R (reception year before grade 1)).

Wonderful Beginnings officially opened its doors on January 20th, 2023, and serves learners from both the Huntington and Justicia villages. It currently has two classrooms available for teaching purposes.

NEEDS: Water; Electricity; Classrooms; Teaching and visual aids.



Itsoseng Day Care

In partnership with: Marataba Luxury Lodges and Marataba Community & Conservation Foundation, Limpopo

Itsoseng is a daycare centre situated in the Limpopo region, near Marataba Luxury Lodges. We have recently become aware of the centre's need for support in order to provide daily meals and infrastructure assistance for the children it serves. Our goal is to help Itsoseng grow into a facility that effectively serves the children of the community. Presently, the school has a total of 64 enrolled learners.

NEEDS: 2 additional classrooms.



MCF Gauteng Project

After successfully completing projects with Frida Hartley Shelter, MCF is in the process of identifying another project in the Gauteng area close to the MFC support office to cater for staff's involvement in give back programs facilitated by the foundation.



We are committed to promoting conservation through education and raising awareness for critical conservation projects.

MCF's goals include upskilling for employment, specifically into the tourism group that collaborates with MCF. The majority of the local luxury lodges in the greater Kruger National Park, APNR (Associated Private Nature Reserves) region require a minimum FGASA level 2 qualification, with Lead Trails, ARH, PDP and NDT registration.

More Community Foundation, in collaboration with the MORE Field Guide College and The Good Work Foundation, launched the Community Field Guide Training & Development Programme in 2021. Our aim is to develop local community members into top-tier field guides who have the potential to become eco-tourism, hospitality, and environmental conservation champions in South Africa.

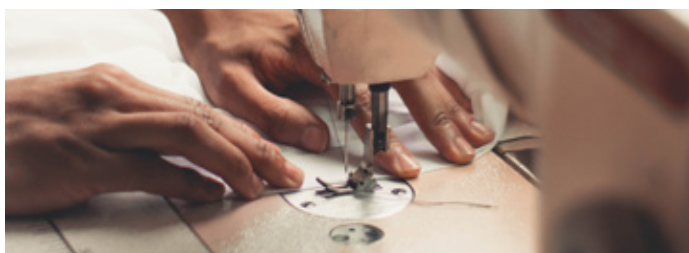
Since our journey began in 2021:

- 35 dedicated Community Field Guides have successfully graduated and been placed as interns and employees across prominent lodges and environmental bodies in South Africa.
- 33 promising students are currently completing their 6 month theoretical training with MORE Field Guide College, and will graduate before the close of 2023.

Qualifying students are placed at one of the MORE Family Collection's five-star lodges, and allocated a mentor to support their development and practical training. This ensures that they are well-equipped to enter the workforce in a meaningful way.

NEEDS: Sponsorship towards the training, qualification and placement of more community field guides.

2. TSEMBA ENTERPRISE DEVELOPMENT [SDG 8: DECENT WORK & ECONOMIC GROWTH]



Thandeka's Sewing Enterprise

In partnership with: Lion Sands Game Reserve, Mpumalanga

Tshemba (Shangaan for 'hope') gives unemployed members in the community the chance to upskill, and create their own source of income. One such project is Thandeka Khoza's - she produces beeswax wraps of such a beautiful quality that they are sold in all MORE Family Collection lodges and hotels. The wraps keep perishable products fresher for longer, and are made from 100% GOTS certified organic cotton, beeswax and tree resin. They are also washable, reusable and compostable.

Thandeka also sews animal toys, and we continue to support her growth opportunities through lodge procurement of her handmade products.



David Shilabi – Local Fresh Produce Farming Enterprise

In partnership with: Lion Sands Game Reserve, Mpumalanga

In line with MORE Family Collection's supplier development programme, we identified a local fresh produce supplier who now supplies all of the Lion Sands Game Reserve lodges. One man is fast becoming an enterprise! This will have a ripple effect that will ultimately impact his community's development on a broader scale.

MCF continues to support growth opportunities for David's business through lodge procurement of his fresh produce.

3. IMPROVING LIVING STANDARDS [SDG6: CLEAN WATER & SANITATION]

In partnership with: all MORE Family Collection properties

This is a MORE Family Collection staff programme, facilitated by MCF, which encourages their people to live the business' values, and in so doing give back to their local communities. They do this by lending a hand at MCF's development projects through our 'Get Your Hands Dirty' initiatives, which sees them roll up their sleeves to help out with building, maintenance, gardening, cleaning, cooking, childcare, and any other tasks that contribute to our projects' success and communities' well-being.

Soul Food



Sentrum Water Project



In partnership with: Marataba Luxury Lodges and Marataba Community & Conservation Foundation, Limpopo

The Sentrum community, also located in the Limpopo region near Marataba Luxury Lodges, has reached out to MCF for assistance regarding their access to water. We have reviewed their request and are eager to establish this new community connection, supporting their development efforts. Watch this space!

This year we are focusing on an issue often overlooked, but of immense importance: providing sanitary care to young girls from underprivileged communities in South Africa. An estimated one third of these girls miss school during their menstrual cycle, an absence that significantly hampers their education and future prospects.

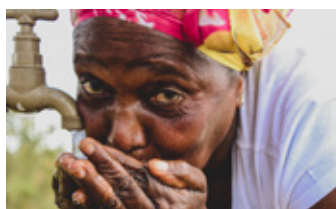
Our solution is simple, yet impactful – reusable sanitary packs. For a low cost, these packs offer a sustainable solution to a pervasive problem, allowing girls to confidently continue with their education, unhindered by their menstrual cycle.

NEED: All it takes is R280 per care pack.

Community Borehole Installations



In partnership with: Stanley & Livingstone Boutique Hotel, Zimbabwe

Three boreholes (bush pumps) have been successfully drilled and completed in three out of the four Woodlands villages, ensuring that community members now have access to this essential resource. This development has had a significant impact in alleviating the burden of walking long distances to fetch water from the nearby dams, which posed considerable risks in a community situated within a remote wilderness area. It is worth noting that these bush pumps are designed to withstand harsh conditions, and are specifically constructed to protect against potential encounters with wild elephants.





Water in Huntington and Justicia B Villages

MCF launched a project to install strategically placed boreholes around Huntington village. Today, these boreholes are fully managed by the Community Development Forum, with ongoing feedback from the community, ensuring a sustainable water management plan chaired by a local committee. Henna Preschool, where water was previously unavailable, now also has its own constant supply of fresh drinking water—benefiting the 132 enrolled learners and, by extension, their families.

The Jabez water extension project in Justicia B followed suit, marking another successful venture. Here, MCF's efforts led to the installation of a drip irrigation system for the community garden, boosting local agriculture and food security.



5. CONSERVATION PROJECTS [SDG 15: LIFE ON LAND]

~ Contributing to conservation through education, awareness and active project development and support



Victoria Falls Black Rhino Conservation Project

The Victoria Falls Black Rhino Conservation Project's aim is to protect and preserve a black rhino population in its natural habitat. This includes monitoring and improving the population; relocating and populating local conservation areas; and inclusively educating local communities to stabilise and maintain community-wilderness buffer zones.

We also collaborate with ecotourism and voluntourism organisations to create awareness, raise funds and collaborate resources.



School Safari Program

The School Safari Project was formed in 2018 to bring environmental education to local communities, giving the youth of Bushbuckridge the opportunity to become part of their neighbouring reserves.

We partnered with the Good Work Foundation (GWF) and Sabi Sand Pfunanani Trust (SSPT) to bring pupils from the local primary and high schools on game drives, giving the learners opportunities to explore and experience the game reserve to learn about animals, plants and habitats that relate to and support their curriculum.

In 2021 we launched School Safaris at Victoria Falls Private Game Reserve, educating Masuwe Primary School learners, and connecting the Woodlands community to its conservation neighbours. In 2023, schools in all our regions of operation will benefit from this program (Injongo in Cape Town will visit the Cape Town Aquarium).



Human Wildlife Conflict

The Woodlands Community is uniquely located within the greater Zambezi National Park, neighbouring Chamabondo National Park and Fuller Forest. This setup means they co-exist with wildlife.

As part of MCF's core Conservation pillar, we are actively involved in human wildlife conflict mitigation. We facilitate conversations, we educate individuals and communities, and we provide operational support to our projects.

Each step taken is a step closer to a safe living environment for humans and wildlife through balancing the natural bio network.



Endangered Wildlife Trust – Wild Dog Project

The African wild dog is a member of Africa's 'Magnificent Seven', and rightly so. But it is also one of its most endangered. The biggest population - numbering just 3000 - is in southern Africa. They are constantly threatened by habitat loss and human-wildlife conflict. South Africa's largest and most viable population of 250 dogs in 22 packs can be found in the Kruger National Park, where the Endangered Wildlife Trust has established its Wild Dog Project.

The project aims to increase the range, number, and status of these animals by securing and expanding their habitats, finding solutions for co-existence with human communities, and supporting legislation to protect them. MCF donates to this important project annually through our fundraising event – 'The Extra Mile Trail Run'.

▶ GET INVOLVED – GUEST, SPONSOR AND VOLUNTEER EXPERIENCES

Many of MORE Family Collection's guests are looking to form a real connection with the places they visit by giving back in tangible ways, which enrich the lives of people here – and guests' own through these experiences.

All experiences can be arranged directly with the lodges and hotels, or booked in advance through MORE Family Collection's Central Reservations.

COMMUNITY EXPERIENCES

Over the years, MCF has built close relationships with MORE Family Collection's local communities in rural villages and urban townships. Visitors are welcomed into the community to meet the residents, visit MCF projects, and see something of life here – a humbling and rewarding experience. MCF Community Experiences are largely customised for each guest or group.

Please note that Community Experiences:

- Are subject to availability
- Include welcome drinks; bottled water, transport in an air-conditioned vehicle (except when a safari vehicle is used); and a tour guide

For Guests Of Lion Sands Game Reserve

Sabi Sand & Kruger National Park

Community experiences are offered to guests directly to our More Community Foundation supported projects in the villages of Huntington and Justicia B. This tour offers insights into rural village life and its everyday experiences.

Included in the itinerary are our Jabez Preschool in Justicia B and Henna Preschool and Wonderful Beginnings in Huntington – to meet the teachers, spend some time with the children, and see the work we are doing with them; and the MCF-supported Huntington Digital Learning Campus in Huntington – where guests can engage with the tutors and learners, and take a walk-through this world-class online learning facility.

- **Departure time:** 10h30
- **Number of guests:** 2–4 (LS vehicle to be booked if group is larger)
- **Travel time:** ±1 hour (one way) – meet at lodge reception
- **Cost:** R780 per person – Fortuner (PDP driver)
- **Tour duration:** ±3 hours
- **Duration:** About 2 hours excluding transfers to the village

We normally leave after breakfast and come back before lunch.

Optional experience (at an additional cost):

- Visit to a local sangoma (traditional healer) – R100 per person per consultation (to be prebooked)

Community experiences on a closed vehicle (Fortuner) preferably for 3–4 guests: R780 (optional but with a charge)

Community Tour on an open vehicle: Complimentary to the guests



NOTE: Community experiences happening on a weekend or over school holidays might not give all options of the 'Get Your Hands Dirty Experience'.

For Guests Of Marataba Luxury Lodges

This experience takes guests on an educational drive to visit some of our most-in-need projects. Heuningvley Primary School and Itsoseng Daycare Centre are included in this experience. Both schools are doing their best to provide a good education to the children of local farm workers and reserve staff.

Guests meet some of the teachers and children and are shown around the school to give them some insight into the work we do and the daily life of locals.

- **Departure time:** 10h30 – meet at lodge reception
- **Travel time:** ± 45 minutes (one way)
- **Tour duration:** ± 2 hours
- **Cost:** R3000.00 per transfer
- **Number of guests:** 2–6 – arrangements can be made for larger groups and additional costs may apply
- **Refreshments included:** water & cold drinks



We encourage guests to visit pre or post their lodge stay – on the way in or out and by getting involved through Pack For Purpose global initiative to provide the school with much needed resources for the learner and teachers.

For Guests Of Cape Cadogan Boutique Hotel & More Quarters Neighbourhood Hotel

This experience gives a very personal and authentic look into life in the townships. The experience takes place at the MCF-supported Injongo Educare Centre in the Mfuleni township where guests can help to make or serve the children breakfast, read, play ball and have singalongs with them. This is followed by a short walk down the road to where the centre began at the home of inspirational founder, Mavis Ngcongolo who will be there to greet the group.

- **Departure times:** After breakfast and lunch – meet at hotel reception
- **Travel time:** ±30 minutes (one way)
- **Tour duration:** 3–4 hours
- **Number of guests:** 2–7
- **Cost:** R2000 per vehicle for 1–3 guests
- **Cost:** R3000 per vehicle for 4–7 guests

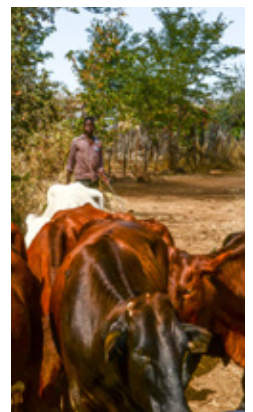


For Guests Of Stanley & Livingstone Boutique Hotel And Ursula's Homestead

This deeply humbling and inspiring experience introduces guests to the Woodlands community on the fringe of Victoria Falls Private Game Reserve that faces extreme challenges but is determined to build a better life for themselves. The experience centres on Masuwe Primary School where 164 children give it their all to learn, despite the challenges they face.

MCF is making extensive upgrades at Masuwe, and guests are invited to see the progress, meet with the school's headmistress and a few of the community leaders, and get introduced to the children. MCF also has a significant conservation arm in the region, supporting the Victoria Falls Black Rhino Conservation Project. Connect with your Programs & Community Coordinator (PCC) for more information and on how to book a safari or rhino experience.

- **Departure time:** After breakfast 9am – meet at hotel reception
- **Travel time:** ±45 minutes (one way)
- **Tour duration:** ±2 hours

Get Your Hands Dirty

Our most popular way for guests to get involved by helping out with project tasks that address local community needs around education, health & environment, and infrastructure. These extraordinary social experiences bring them into the heart of Southern Africa and make for a more meaningful journey.

The activities on this page are an outline of what guests can expect, although each can be customised – guests choose where they wish to help and use their skills to make a difference. Tasks also constantly change and at any point – there is always a lot to be done.

ROLL UP YOUR SLEEVES:

Renovation and upgrades assistance (e.g. digging, building, painting) at one of MCF's projects.

KEEP IT CLEAN:

Infrastructure clean-up (e.g. washing and cleaning classrooms, kitchens, bathrooms, equipment) to maintain facilities.
